“God is Present”

In all of the challenges of life, the Word of God communicates to us that God is ever-present with us in each and every situation we face.

He is present in the good times: the marriage of a daughter, the birth of a grandchild, the celebration of a retirement, and the celebration of a birthday or anniversary. God is also present when we fall ill, in times of disappointment, during personal challenges, in difficult decisions, and in grievous circumstances.

As a part of my devotional time, I am reading through a little book called “The Red Sea Rules” by Robert Morgan. Early in the book, he talks about a South African pastor by the name of Andrew Murray who was facing a crisis in his ministry. Pastor Murray was a prolific writer and journaled daily. In one of his journal entries, Pastor Murray wrote the following in the midst of his crisis:

“First, God brought me here, it is by His will that I am in this strait place: in that fact I will rest. Next, He will keep me here in His love, and give me grace to behave as His child. Then, He will make the trial a blessing, teaching me the lessons He intends me to learn, and working in me the grace He means to bestow. Last, in His good time He can bring me out again – how and when He knows” (Morgan, p. 12).

Isn't that what Scripture tells us?

“The steps (and the stops) of a good man are ordered by the LORD, and He delights in his way. Though he fall, he shall not be utterly cast down; for the LORD upholds him with His hand.” Psalm 37:23-24

“For He Himself has said, ‘I will never leave you nor forsake you.’ So we may boldly say: ‘The LORD is my helper; I will not fear. What can man do to me?’” Hebrews 13:5b

“And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose.” Romans 8:28

God communicates to us four important things that we want to remember in the good and difficult times. I am here, right now, in this situation:

By God's appointment or by God's allowance,
I am always in His keeping,
God is always teaching and training me,
God will keep me here for His time...

We serve a God Who is trustworthy; a God in whom we can delight in; a God in whom we can commit our way; and a God who gives us rest through life's circumstances (Psalm 37).
